Feed, Flatulence and Global Warming



You just sat down in your favorite chair, ready for some relaxation when those big brown eyes peep over the arm and catch your gaze, your buddy, your loyal companion, comes running ready for a hug and affection. As he jumps to meet your gaze and lick your cheek, Fido pauses, lifts his tail and passes flatulence. Dog owners everywhere accept this phenomenon as part of the ownership relationship. We accept, we make excuses, we cover our noses, and we continue on in our love and affection for our Fidos. But do we have concerns over Fido's gas and global warming?


In the past thirty years the production of methane and its leakage into our environment has almost doubled. With global warming not merely a fear but reality, people blame the greenhouse affect on farm animals for their burps, droppings and flatulence. But Dogs, like cows, pigs and other animals, suffer from flatulence, and their flatulence produces that same deadly gas called methane. The difference? This methane is right in your living room, in your yard, in your neighborhood! Unlike farm animals miles away, your pet's methane is right next to you, adding to the global warming crisis that is happening right in your living room.

Dietary Habits, Methane Production and Commercial Pet Foods

Diet is the critical factor in the flatulence production of methane. Flatulence consists of gases produced by the bacteria and yeasts living in the airless intestinal tract of mammals. Flatulence emits methane, carbon dioxide and a small but deadly set of odiferous sulfuric compounds into the environment.

Foods producing flatulence are high in carbohydrates. Most of us don't read the composition of Fido's dinner. But we must realize that those little nuggets we feed our pets are loaded with carbohydrates. These flatulent producing meals include yams, sweet potatoes, chickpeas, citrus rinds, chestnuts, broccoli, cabbage, and yeast products.


produce strong and odiferous gas along with methane, which intensifies in dogs who

Kangaroos are one of the animals studied and found to not emit methane in their flatulence. Scientists are now analyzing the Kangaroo's diet to find out why. They have discovered that kangaroos

- Don't gulp food
- Consume fewer bean products
- Don't gulp air while eating.

Scientists are studying how to transfer this knowledge into the production of pet and livestock foods that can reduce methane emissions.



Prevention

We know that reducing the demand for beef can reduce the greenhouse effects, but what can we do about Fido? Scientists are making headway in the following manner: adjusting a cow's diet, or adding certain methane reducing agents such as garlic to the diet will eliminate the elimination issue. Scientists have also begun studying how to use cow poop and its methane emissions more beneficially. Cow poop can be converted to methane then tapped, bottled and used for energy. Dog manure however, cannot be treated in the same fashion. Their poop does not emit the same level of methane therefore it is not

vegetarians? Do we give up our pets? Do we all avoid eating beans? The solution lies in creatively thinking outside the box. Why not create a flatulence tax? There could be a percentage of income used for emission control. Perhaps scientists could develop flatulence


atmosphere and one wonders how our fragile environment can sustain itself.

Although farm animals produce the largest amount of greenhouse gas—over 80 million metric tons per year, household pets such as Fido can collectively emit over 30 million tons of methane. Other big sources of methane are landfills 40 tons, coalmines 35 tons, rice paddies 70 tons and wetlands with 115 tons of methane emissions annually.





This large jump is illustrated when the salaries of different levels of education are put next to each other.

People with a Bachelors degree usually make more than people with an Associates degree.



Instructions on playing

7. You can then play again or exit the game.


