# Montana Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance: Funding:

Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$5,825,871<sup>i</sup>

Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$5,225,728

• Percent change: -10.3%

#### **CTE Student Outcomes Data:**

- CTE students in Montana graduated from high school at a higher rate than the statewide rate in 2008-2009 (96% compared to 81%).
- 98% of secondary CTE students in Montana completed their high school education on time.<sup>iii</sup>
- Almost all (98%) of secondary CTE students in Montana were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010.
- The majority (86%) of postsecondary CTE students in Montana persisted in their postsecondary program or transferred to another program in 2009-2010.<sup>v</sup>

#### **CTE Enrollment Data:**

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Montana in 2009-2010: 11,711<sup>vi</sup>
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in Montana in 2009-2010: 5,341<sup>vii</sup>

## CTE: Preparing Montana's Students for Jobs of Today and Jobs of the Future

From today through 2018 in MT:

- → The Hospitality and Tourism Career Cluster will be the largest overall, and Information and Technology will be the fastest growing.
- → Jobs in Information and Technology will increase by 22% by 2018.
- → 43% of all jobs in Montana will be found in the Hospitality and Tourism, Business Management and Administration, and Market, Sales, and Services Career Cluster.
- → By 2018, there will be about 53,000 jobs for those in Montana with certificates.
