# New Hampshire Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance: Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$6,086,100<sup>i</sup>
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$5,526,718
- Percent change: -9.19%

#### **CTE Student Outcomes Data:**

- About 9 out of 10 postsecondary CTE students persisted in their certificate, credential, or degree programs in 2009-2010.
- ➤ Almost all CTE students in New Hampshire (97%) completed high school on time in 2009-2010.
- ➤ 4 out of 5 secondary CTE students in New Hampshire were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010.

#### **CTE Enrollment Data:**

- ➤ Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in New Hampshire in 2009-2010: 12,091<sup>iv</sup>
- Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in New Hampshire in 2009-2010: 13,062<sup>v</sup>

### CTE: Preparing New Hampshire's Students for Jobs of Today and Jobs of the Future

From today through 2018 in NH:

- Business Management and
   Administration will be the largest Career
  Cluster overall.
- → Health Science will experience the fastest growth, increasing by 29% by 2018.
- → In 2018, 43% of all jobs in NH will be found in Business Management and Administration, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Hospitality and Tourism.
- → In NH by 2018, there will be about 74,000 jobs for those with certificates.
