South Dakota Career Technical Education (CTE) Statistics At-A-Glance:

Funding:

- Perkins Funds Received in FY10: \$4,697,519ⁱ
- Perkins Funds Received in FY11: \$4,214,921
- ➤ Percent change: -10.27%

CTE Student Outcomes Data:

- ➤ 9 out of every 10 postsecondary CTE students met or exceeded technical skill proficiency levels in 2009-2010.
- > 97% of secondary CTE students in South Dakota completed high school on time."
- ➤ Almost all (97%) secondary CTE students in South Dakota were employed, in the military, or in postsecondary education or advanced training six months after graduation in 2009-2010.

- Number of Secondary Students Enrolled in CTE in South Dakota in 2009-2010: 26,386iv
- ➤ Number of Postsecondary Students Enrolled in CTE in South Dakota in 2009-2010: 3,735^v

From today through 2018 in SD:

- → The Hospitality and Tourism Career Cluster will be the largest in SD.
- → Jobs in Health Science will increase by 22% by 2018.
- → Hospitality and Tourism will add the most jobs.
- → 40% of all jobs in South Dakota will be found in the Hospitality and Tourism, Marketing, Sales, and Services, and Business Management and Administration Career Clusters.
- → In South Dakota by 2018, there will be about 49,000 jobs for those with certificates.
