Purpose of cPass project:

To develop more authentic college and career assessments in CTE



Authentic assessments in CTE

- General CTE assessment
 - Common to all CTE Pathways
 - Measures College & Career Readiness
 - Computer-based and Performance Tasks
- Specific Pathway assessments:
 - Specific to the content of each Pathway
 - Computer-based and Performance Tasks



General CTE Assessment

Assesses students' knowledge/skills in the following areas:

- 1. Academic Foundations
 - Reading and Math aligned with CCSS
 - Scientific Reasoning
- 2. Information and Communication
- 3. Collaboration and Teamwork
- 4. Safety, Health, and Environment
- 5. Leadership
- 6. Employability and Career Development



General CTE Assessment

- Item Types
 - Multiple Choice
 - Technology Enhanced
 - Situational Judgment

Sit-down, computer-based assessment

- Performance Tasks (still under construction)
- Students eligible for the General CTE
 - Juniors and Seniors who have completed or are currently enrolled in a technical level course (mid-level of a Pathway)
