Please be advised that Passaic County Community College (PCCC) has an articulation agreement whereby Passaic County Technical Institute (PCTI) students receive three college credits for several criminal justice classes, through concurrent enrollment, whereby certified PCTI instructors are qualified as experts in their instructional area. The courses include:

- 1. Introduction to Criminal Justice
- 2. Introduction to Homeland Security
- 3. Juvenile Delinquency and Youth Crime
- 4. Investigative Function/Criminal Investigation
- 5. Drug and Alcohol Use, Misuse, and Abuse


