Creator and lead facilitator for SPARKS, a two-week summer program for at-risk incoming Freshmen that focuses on community building, career exploration and academic skills development. SPARKS has included 97 students in the past three years and over 80% of students remained on track for graduation following their Freshman Year.

Leader in a school-wide transition to Pathways for all ninth and tenth grade students. Data from this model indicates that <u>over 70% of students</u> <u>felt connected to PHS</u> after the first 8 weeks of school and the <u>number of courses</u> failed by freshmen dropped 40% from 2016 to 2017.
